

Resources for Boulder County Residents Impacted by Wildfire

In response to the devastating Marshall Fire, Boulder County and a network of community partners will open a Disaster Assistance Center beginning Monday, January 3 to help evacuees and others impacted by the fire with a range of services including property loss and insurance claims, financial and food assistance, mental health supports, help with heating, transportation, and more. **The Boulder County Disaster Assistance Center (DAC), located at the Boulder County Southeast County Hub at 1755 South Public Road in Lafayette, will operate from 9:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. seven days a week**, and will include specialists from Boulder County, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), the Red Cross, Mental Health Partners, and many other area government and nonprofit organizations.
